**Susan Luparell, PhD, RN, CNE, ANEF.** Dr. Luparell holds a doctorate in Administration, Curriculum, and Instruction with a focus in Educational Leadership and Higher Education. A Fellow in the Academy of Nursing Education, she is a nationally-recognized speaker on how to foster healthy learning environments for students, faculty, and staff within nursing education. Her scholarship focuses on the ethical implications of incivility, including how it affects others and how it can be managed in academic and clinical settings.

Prior to joining NCSBN in 2019, Jason spent 10 years with Pearson VUE supporting the NCLEX and other NCSBN programs in various roles at the executive level. His background also includes 12 years developing educational assessments in the areas of mathematics and science, numerous conference presentations and publications, and a Toastmaster of the Year award. Jason holds degrees in mathematics from the University of Oregon and the University of California, Berkeley.



**Eli Brand.** Eli recently graduated from the University of Southern Mississippi's Honors College, with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and distinction of Magna Cum Laude. Prior to attending USM, Brand received his AA degree from Meridian Community College. ## Objectives:

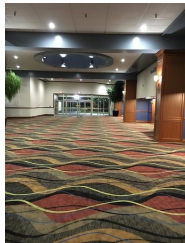
At the conclusion of the conference the participant will:
